We are currently recruiting for Nurse Practitioners to join our Clinical team for full or part-time positions the primary location for these roles will be North Dumfries but both may involve work at our Cambridge location. The NP is responsible for providing primary care functions and participating in the development, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of programs and services for individuals, families and the community and serve the vulnerable sector in a manner that increases access and decreases barriers to health care

A successful candidate in this role would have

- Baccalaureate in Nursing, Primary Health Care Nurse Practitioner Certificate
- College of Nurses of Ontario Certificate of Competence with RN (EC) designation (unrestricted)
- Minimum 2 years' experience as an NP in a primary care setting, experience in a Community Health Centre setting would be considered an asset.
- Experience working with complex patients
- Experience working as a member of a multidisciplinary team
- Clear understanding of the Social Determinates of Health.
- Experience with Chronic Disease Management
- Experience in program development, implementation, monitoring and evaluation.
- Must be available to work evenings.

In this role you will be expected to complete the following tasks

- Provides primary care functions to vulnerable individual's experiencing increased barriers to health care services.
- Perform assessment, diagnosis, treatment, health education/counselling and other clinical activities according
 to the College of Nurses of Ontario standards of practice for Registered Nurses in the Extended Class (NPs).
- Contribute to chart documentation, participate in chart reviews and case conferences, and make referrals.
- Participate in the development, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of treatment, education, counselling and health promotion programs and services for individuals, families and the community.
- Apply the determinants of health model and the Ontario College of Nurses Standards of Practice for RN (EC) to the provision of well person, episodic and stable chronic illness care to people of all ages and diverse backgrounds.
- Apply and participate in the development of appropriate professional and organizational policies, protocols and procedures.
- Understand the role of, refer appropriately to and communicate effectively with other health professionals and community services.
- Participate in the development and maintenance of Langs health resource materials.
- Other duties as assigned.
